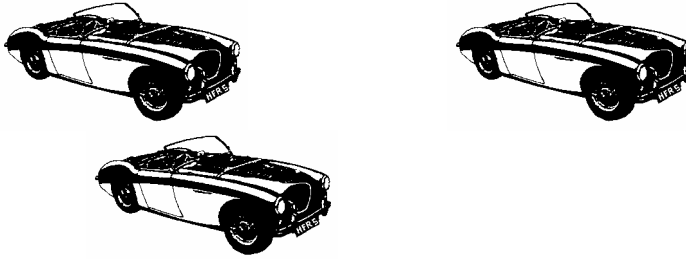


Thames Valley Austin Healey Club Quiz
